Ralph Bertie Cator had first arrived in Mombasa in September 1896 as Judicial Officer and Legal Vice-Consul EAP, at £600 pa. He was appointed Protectorate Judge EAP 14 July 1897, shortly before this letter was sent. There was a brief opportunity for meeting with Falloon in December 1904 before his departure from Zanzibar on 23 January 1905 to be Senior Judge at Constantinople.


Inward Underpaid Mail - Surcharge Notice

Shown is an EAP&T 'P.5' form that has been issued in respect of an incoming 'understamped postal article'. This notice would have been placed in the addressee's post box, as mail was not delivered in East Africa but had to be collected from the Post Office. In this case, the correct postal regulations, as directed by the text (shown below on a digital scan), have not been followed, since the postage due stamps, for the surcharge amount of 2s50c, should have been on the underpaid item. These have, instead, been affixed to the back of the notice and have been cancelled at KIKUYU on 28 March 61.



Though the 4s 70c per ½ ounce trans-Atlantic rate from East Africa to the USA, which came into effect from 15 December 1943, was a reduction, it still represented a considerable cost at that time. Nevertheless, the above cover, cancelled at NAIROBI on 13 January 45, has been paid at <u>five</u> times this rate - 23s50c, including scarce commercial use on cover of a KG6 £1 value. The letter to Chicago must, therefore, have weighed over 2 ounces. Unfortunately, it bears no endorsements and no transit marks have been applied to indicate the route taken. Almost certainly, it would have been flown on the BOAC Empire ('Horseshoe Route') service to Khartoum to connect with the Trans-African service to Lagos, flown weekly from Egypt at this time. Onward routing from there is unknown, but it could have been flown on the West African service to Lisbon, to be carried on the trans-Atlantic service, which was operating on its winter (southerm) route at this date. The letter has been opened for inspection on arrival in the US and resealed with 'EXAMINED BY' tape.


