[65c] Airmail Letter Rate to the UK - Late Issue of Exact Value Stamps On 1 July 1931, the letter rate to the UK was increased from 60c to 65c per % ounce. This remained in effect for four years, but for all but two months of this, no 65c stamp was available. Eventually, the rate was catered for on 1 May 1935, when a new set of KG5 definitive stamps was issued and, on the 6th, the Silver Jubilee set was issued - both containing a 65c value. Neither, however, was to remain current for long, as the rate was reduced to 50c on 1 July 1935. Examples used during the short period in which they were appropriate are shown on the above two covers, cancelled at DARESSALAAM on 26 June 35 and at NAIROBI on 23 May 35.

[65c] Airmail Letter Rate to the UK - Triple As air services were developed in the mid-to-late 1930s, postal rates dropped gradually, but war was soon to make low-cost airmail a thing of the past. The airmail rate to the UK was at its highest pre-war rate, of 65c per 1/2 ounce, for a 4-year period between 1 July 1931 and 1 July 1935. The cover shown, cancelled at NAIROBI on 6 February 34, was sent during this period, but has been paid at 1s95c - triple rate, so the item could have weighed up to an ounce and a half. The letter would have been flown on Imperial Airways' service AN153, which was flown from Nairobi by Helena, a day late, on 11 February. In fact, by the time the mail reached Croydon on the 20th, it was three days behind schedule. The photo at the top of the page shows Helena, a Handley Page HP42 airliner, at Croydon on the occasion of the start of the South African service in January 1932.

Africa was justifiably named "The Dark Continent" during Queen Victoria's reign, with East Africa one of several significant areas little known to Europeans 353 Mill Street, Perth, Scotland Edition limited to five hundred copies for sale until the closing decades of the 19th century. Likewise, generations of philatof which this is monther 196 elists have encountered a marked dearth of literature on the postage stamps of British East Africa, although several postal history aspects of the area have been ably covered in recent years. The most useful guide for collectors of BEA has been the paper published by H. L. Hayman and Charles J. Phillips in 1903. Much factual information on the early issues had been obtained by Hayman from the Imperial British East Africa Company. As will be evident from the hibliography (Appendix IV), little has been written on the stamps of British East Africa during the past 77 years. Articles and publications omitted from this bibliography have been of a superficial nature and usually contain numerous errors. The object of this volume is to fill a gap in the field of philatelic literature, based upon a study of the stamps covering 20 years and supported by an association with three notable collectors of East Africa, all Fellows of the Royal Firstly, I must thank Stuart Rosaiter, Editor of The London Philatellor, for his corrections, criticisms and suggestions on the draft manuscript and his experienced guidance on production problems. Kenneth Pennycuick, Ph.D. has willingly provided help and advice over the years and his cradition has greatly furthered my philatelic education. Third of the trio is Roy Dunstan, an excellent host on philatelic weekends at his Warminster home, who has provided endless encouragement and unlimited access to his collection, library and postal history records. Help has been received from Marcus Samuel regarding proofs and specimens, also the Curator of the National Postal Museum re the De La Rue records. Finally, but not least, my gratitude is due to the Coursell and Publi-cations Committee of the Royal Philatelic Society, London, for having sufficient faith in the manuscript to authorise its publication.
