**BRITISH OCCUPATION OF GERMAN EAST AFRICA**

Following the invasion of German East Africa by Allied Forces, the Civilian mail was accepted by the Indian Army Postal Service. Some Offices reverted to Civilian control on 1<sup>st</sup> June, 1917 and these used the stamps of East Africa and Uganda until the 'G.E.A.' overprinted stamps were issued in October, 1917. The last Field Post Office in the southern part of the country did not come under Civilian control until 15<sup>th</sup> March, 1919. German East Africa came under British Mandatory rule by the 1919 Treaty of Versailles and changed the name to TANGANYIKA in January 1920. The terms of the Mandate was agreed by the Council of the League of Nations on 20<sup>th</sup> July 1922.

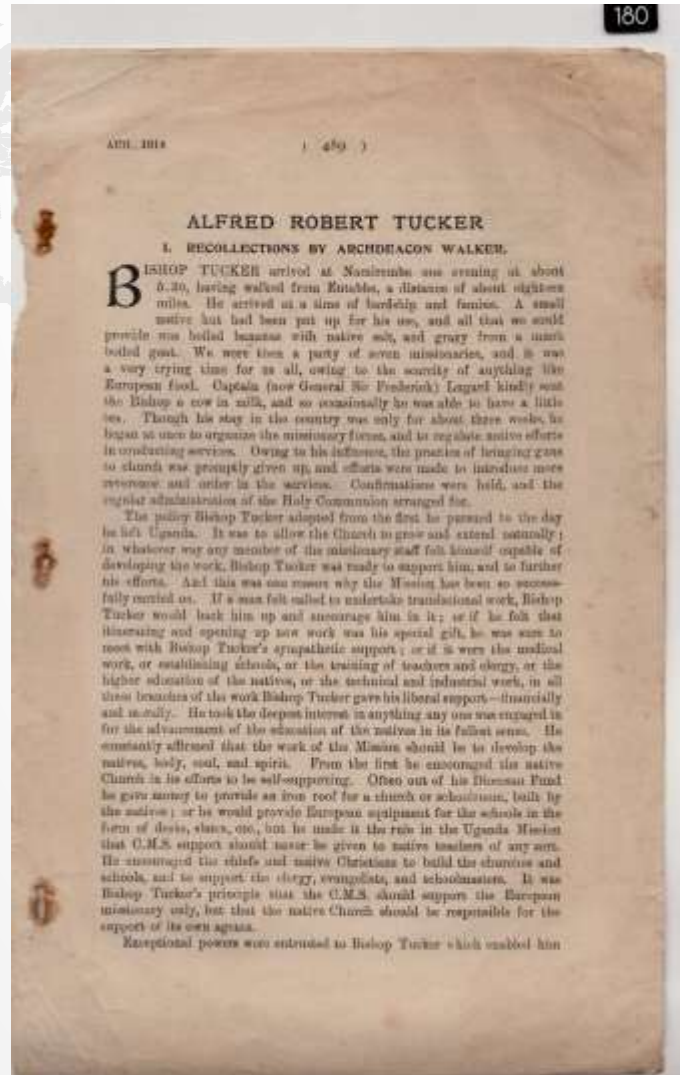

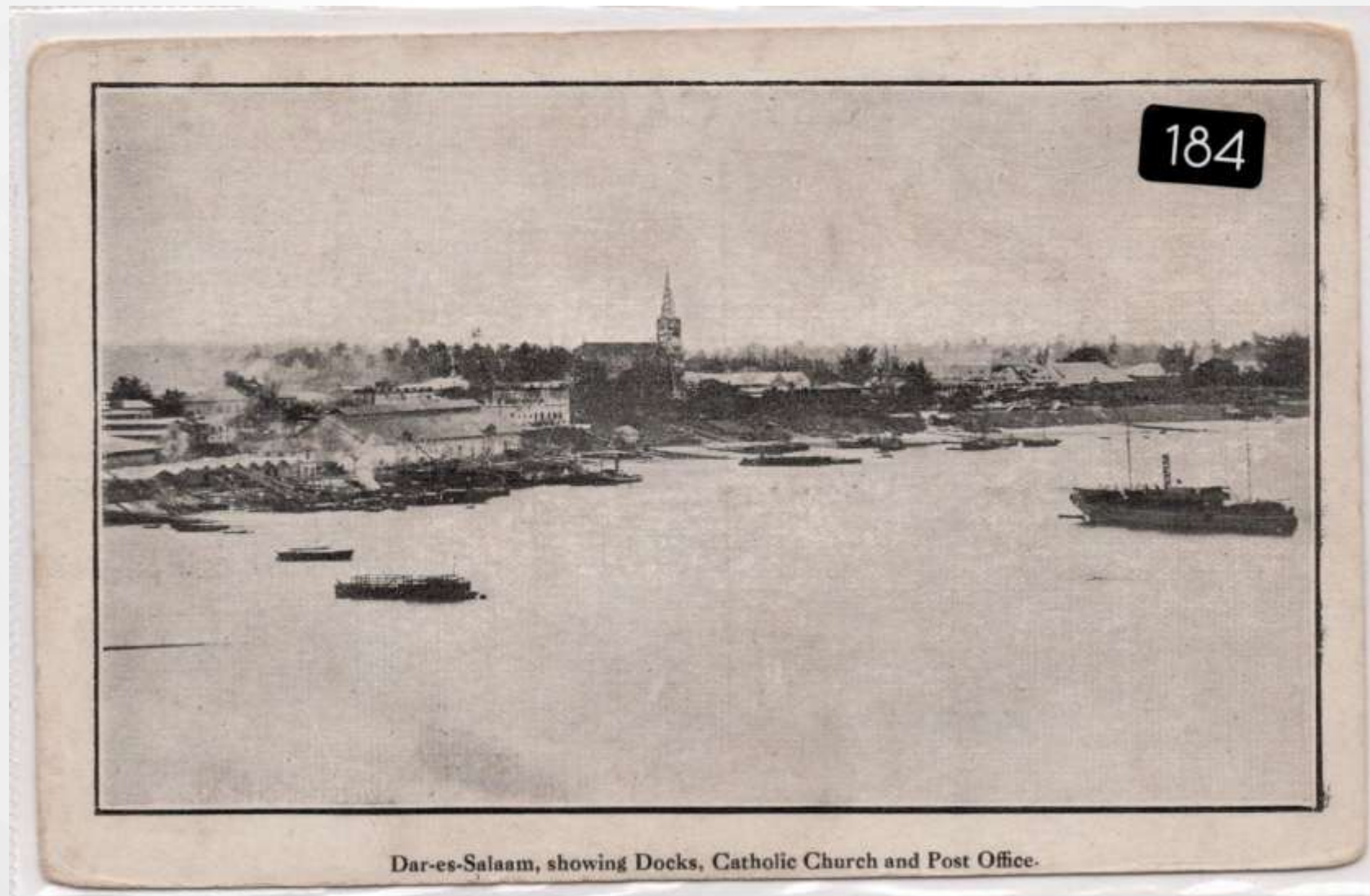
